

HOW LONG SHOULD I BE ABLE TO STAND ON ONE LEG?

A study carried out in America revealed that:

- People Under 40 with eyes opened averaged 45 seconds. With eyes closed, 15 seconds
- People aged 40-49 with eyes opened averaged 42 seconds. With eyes closed, 13 seconds
- People aged 50-59 with eyes opened averaged 41 seconds. With eyes closed, 8 seconds
- People aged 60-69 with eyes opened averaged 32 seconds. With eyes closed, 4 seconds
- People aged 70-79 with eyes opened averaged 22 seconds. With eyes closed, 3 seconds

We would like to share with you, some of the lovely, positive comments we have received from parents this term...

Dear Mr Portrey,

We wanted to say a very big thank you to Mr Thomas for organising the Year 5 swimming at the end of last half term after they missed out in Year 3.

We had to give up our daughter's swimming lessons when the dreaded Covid hit back in 2020 and we never got round to doing them again. She'd only just began to swim a very short distance, but two and a half years later it was all forgotten and her confidence had gone in the pool, so much so she was fearful of letting go of the noodle on our holiday back in August. So when the letter came home about Year 5 getting the opportunity to do a week of swimming we knew it would help her.

She went from being put in a group with non-swimmers, because she was, to then being moved up to the next group the following day with Mr Pawlusek. Now we don't know if it was peer pressure but she was determined that she would swim unaided the width of the pool on her back, which she did. The following day she swam a width on her front! She was so proud of her achievement and we were too.

We've now got her weekly lessons and yesterday, only being her second lesson, I witnessed her swim four full lengths of the pool completely unaided and jump/dive in at the deep end too. The difference from two weeks ago is absolutely astonishing.

If it wasn't for Mr Thomas organising the swimming and for the Year 3 teachers doing the lessons she wouldn't have progressed so quickly. So thank you ever so much for giving them the opportunity to do this it really was very much appreciated. And also thank you to you too for driving them there and back.
